## DOMESTIC VIOLENCE FAST TRACK TREATMENT PROGRAM POLICY

#### 1. <u>Eligibility</u>

Defendants with no criminal history of Domestic Violence and Defendants who have not been convicted of a crime for ten (10) years will be eligible for this program.

Exceptions to this requirement may be granted upon approval of a Judge of the Court of Common Pleas.

#### 2. Purpose

The program is designed to place Defendants accused of Domestic Violence into treatment quickly. This will hopefully end any ongoing threats of Domestic Violence and treat the applicable issues while still fresh from the incident.

#### 3. Criminal Proceedings

Defendants charged with any Domestic Violence crime shall make application to the Office of District Attorney to be accepted into the program on or before the first appearance in Central Court or prior to an entry of guilty plea or trial, if charged with a summary offense.

The Office of District Attorney, Victim/Witness Coordinator and Magisterial

District Judge must approve of the placement of Defendant into the program. Upon
approval if charged with a misdemeanor or felony, Defendant must waive Defendant's
right to Defendant's preliminary hearing and sign conditions for the program. If charged
with a summary offense, Defendant must request the proceedings be continued at the

Office of the appropriate Magisterial District Judge. The approved application and
signed conditions must be forwarded by the Office of District Attorney to a Judge of the

Court of Common Pleas who shall issue an Order indicating Defendant has been accepted into the Program. A copy of the Order shall be forwarded by the Clerk of Courts to the Office of Adult Probation which shall be responsible to move forward with the needed treatment and evaluations for Defendant.

#### 4. Terms and Conditions

Upon application and acceptance into the program, Defendant will be subject to the following terms and conditions:

- (a) Complete a Drug and Alcohol Evaluation and follow any recommendations of said Evaluation;
- (b) Attend and successfully complete the Men Against Abuse Program through Crossroads Counseling, Inc. or any other provider offering the Domestic Abuse Intervention Project/ Duluth Model;
- (c) Report to Clinton County Office of Adult Probation when instructed;
- (d) Obey the directions of any Adult Probation Officer;
- (e) Obey the law;
- (f) Submit to drug and alcohol testing at the request of any service provider and/or the Adult Probation Office;
- (g) Pay all costs associated with the above services;
- (h) Special conditions imposed by the Court, the Magisterial District Judge and/or Office of Adult Probation;
- (i) Appear at all court appearances; and
- (j) Pay any restitution directed by the Office of Adult Probation.

- 5. If Defendant successfully completes all requirements of the programs, upon application to the Court of Common Pleas, the criminal charge(s) will be dismissed, court costs will be remitted, and Defendant shall have the right to have the record expunged. The District Attorney may maintain a record of those placed into this program to utilize in determining a Defendant's future eligibility for this program.
- 6. If Defendant has not completed the Program within six (6) months of the Order issued by the Court placing Defendant into said program or violates any condition of the program, Office of Adult Probation shall notify the Court and a status hearing shall be scheduled.

# DOMESTIC VIOLENCE FAST TRACK TREATMENT PROGRAM

Upon agreement of the District Attorney, Victim/Witness Coordinator, and Defendant, and approval of the Court, the Defendant must abide by the following conditions:

- 1. Complete a Drug and Alcohol Evaluation and follow any recommendations of said Evaluation.
- 2. Attend and successfully complete the Men Against Abuse Program (MAAP) through Crossroads Counseling, Inc. or any other provider offering the Domestic Abuse Intervention Project/Duluth Model.
- 3. Report to Clinton County Adult Probation Office when instructed.
- 4. Obey the direction of any Adult Probation Officer.

7. Pay all costs associated with the above services.

- 5. Obey the law.
- 6. Submit to drug and alcohol testing at the request of any service provider and/or the Adult Probation Office.
- 8. Special conditions imposed by the Court, the Magisterial District Judge and/or the Adult Probation Office:
- 9. Appear at all court appearances.

Upon satisfactory completion of the above conditions and any required treatment, Defendant and/or Defendant's attorney must submit appropriate documentation to the Court, along with a Petition to Dismiss the Criminal Charge(s), to Remit all Costs and Expunge the Record.

### CROSSROADS COUNSELING, INC.

Outpatient Counseling Services

The Men Against Abuse Program is a 13 week program for perpetrators of domestic violence. The program meets two times per week, two hours per session. The program is designed to facilitate men in changing their abusive and violent behaviors which are often directed at their loved ones. It is based on the curriculum designed by the Domestic Abuse Intervention Project / Duluth Model. The group program focuses on 8 basic themes. The themes are:

- 1. Using intimidation
- 2. Using coercion and threats
- 3. Using emotional abuse
- 4. Using isolation
- 5. Using economic abuse
- 6. Using male privilege
- 7. Using children
- 8. Minimizing, denying and blaming

Domestic violence is about control, it is not about anger. Batterers use the above tactics, along with the threat of violence to control their partners' actions. The MAAP program combines didactic presentations, videos, homework assignments and routine self-analysis to challenge the batterer's views regarding their interpersonal relationships as well as their controlling behavior. All members are required to participate on a weekly basis and complete all assignments. Accountability is at the core of change.

#### Fees:

Initial consultation: \$40 Group sessions: \$25 Exit interview: \$40

Payments must be made at each session. Three unexcused absences will result in dismissal from the program and the participant will be required to re-start the program.

- 1. Voluntary referrals
- 2. Referrals by the PA Board of Probation and Parole
- 3. County probation offices
- 4. Plea agreements
- 5. County Children and Youth agencies
