

Name: Cranesbill Geranium maculatum

Phonetic Spelling: jer-AY-nee-um mak-yuh-LAH-tum

Description: Wild geranium is a woodland perennial flower in the Geraniaceae family that will naturalize in optimum growing conditions. This plant is found naturally in base-rich, mesic forests. The leaves are opposite and lobed with a toothed margin.

Height: 1 to 2 Feet Tall

Bloom Color: Pink or light purple flowers **Bloom Season:** Mid Spring to Late Spring

Sun: Light shade to partial sunlight.

Soil: Moist to slightly dry conditions, and rich loamy soil with abundant

organic matter.
