

Name: False Sunflower Heliopsis helianthoides

Phonetic Spelling: hee-lee-OP-sis hee-lee-an-THOY-dees

**Description:** Heliopsis helianthoides is similar to Helianthus, the true sunflower. It is an easy to grow plant that flourishes in moist to dry, open woodlands, prairies, and fields. It tolerates a wide range of soil conditions, including poor soil but does best in moist, well-drained soil in full sun.

**Height:** a herbaceous perennial that may grow 3 to 5 feet tall.

**Bloom Color:** Brown/copper, yellow/gold, orange

**Bloom Season:** 

Sun: Full sun to partial shade

**Soil:** Moist to dry, open woodlands, prairies, and fields. It tolerates a wide range of soil conditions, including poor soil but does best in moist, well-drained soil in full sun.

**Pollinators:** Its flowers are attractive to bees, butterflies and other pollinators. Its seed may be eaten by songbirds.

**Pests:** Some susceptibility to aphids. Taller plants may need staking or other support.
